Poster Presentation Guideline

- Poster panel size is **A0 portrait (841mm in width × 1189mm in height)**. Choose a poster size that fits the available space.
- Prepare a clear title in the top of poster with your poster number.
- Include author names, affiliations, and contact information.
- State the purpose of your research. Provide background to help the audience understand your research.
- Briefly explain the methods used in your research.
- Explain your findings using concise text, graphs, charts and images.
- Discuss your results
- Summarize the findings and their significance.
- Present references

Poster Short Talk and Poster Session

- Before starting the poster session, we will have a short talk session. 2-3min talk (never exceeding 3min) for each poster.
- The short talk aims to grab **the attention of audience** and provide **a brief overview** of your poster to generate interest.
- Indeed, delivering a short talk before the poster session is at the presenter's discretion and is **not mandatory**. Of course, the organizing committee strongly recommends the presenters to deliver the short talks.

To deliver your short talk

1. Please send an email **indicating your decision** regarding the short talk to poster-ppt@afc2023.org
2. Please send a PowerPoint file as an attached document to poster-ppt@afc2023.org
 - The maximum file size is 10M
 - Slides should be 3 or less, including the title slide.
 - Please send your file by Nov. 30, 2023.
3. Your ppt files are stored in a note-PC of the AFC organizer, and all the files are deleted after the short talk.
 - Microsoft PowerPoint on Windows 10

How to deliver your short talk at AFC

- The short talk session will be held in Room A.
- The short talks will be made **in order of the poster numbers**.
- Your allotted time is **3 minutes (max)**.
- Please stand by behind the previous speakers and proceed with presentations in order. Use note-PC prepared by the organizer.
- Please introduce yourself and your research. The chairperson does not introduce you.
- Details will be explained immediately before the session.
